2000 dates

A WORKABLE CALENDAR is still to be confirmed, but already four Historic and three Truck meetings have been scheduled. AT SANDOWN'S HISTORIC a scrutineering blitz was undertaken which only three cars failed to pass. Two were logged for slotted discs and one (a Mini) for adjustable front casters. The Chev Camaro of WA's Paul Stubber had already been logged for accident damage and was allowed to run after approval from all competitors, but not for trophies.

AROUND THE TRAPS - racing

Penrite Historic - Sandown - October 23-24

THE CHEV CAMARO of Paul Stubber arrived in Victoria a week after Bathurst with a dispensation to race at the big Historic but under condition that the West Australian combination were no eligible for trophies or points.

Stubber topped qualifying with a 1:24.7366 to outpoint Tino Leo's Monaro, Drew Marget in his Mustang, the Charger of Rob Burns, Ian Jones' Torana, the Chris Stephen Mustang, Steve Coad's Torana, Greg McPherson in his Mustang, the Falcon of Wayne Purdon and Ray Challis who edged out the similar Torana of Les Dole for tenth.

Following through from qualifying Stubber led the opening race, plundered the lap record on the second lap with a 1:22.6856 then handed the lead to Marget for a lap before going on to win narrowly.

Burns held third after the opening lap but lost it to Stephen the next time around. He lost a couple of more places before retiring after four tours.

Meanwhile Jones surrendered fourth to Leo who ultimately finished third clear of McPherson, Jones, Coad, Challis, Purdon, Dole the Nova of Les Walmsley and the Mustangs of Andrew Canon, Chris Ralph and SA's Mike Erwin.

Marget commandeered the front running in the second outing for the first three laps before Stubber assumed control for victory. Third went to McPherson after Leo fell away on the second lap. Stephen was fourth, dogged all the way by Jones while Purdon led a freight train comprising Challis, Walmsley, Dole, Ralph and Cannon.

Mark Brewster was next in his Torana from the similar Holden of Dylan Innes, Leo, the larger Galaxie of Paul Trevethan and the Mini Cooper S's of Len Read, Ted Brewster and Daniel Read.

For the third and feature race the dominant Camaro was pushed to the back of the grid. Stephen led away from McPherson, Jones, Walmsley, Dole, Purdon, Cannon, Leo and Stubber up to tenth by the end of lap one.

Stubber charged to fouth on lap two, and led by the end of the third. From there he sailed away to win the eight lapper by over nine seconds from Stephen with Leo climbing to third. Then followed Purdon, Jones, Dole, McPherson, Challis, Ralph and Marget tenth after Walmsley pulled out at three quarter distance. Mark Brewster was next ahead of Coad, Innes, Trevethan, Ted Brewster and the Mini of Cameron Spence.

Formula Vee Nationals support - Barbagallo - October 23-24

AFTER EFFORTLESSLY DOMINATING the first race, the sting went out of the Falcon Rally Sprint and Bill Meeke could not be an effective force in the feature 15-lapper with compulsory pit stop and driver change.

The combination easily out-pointed the Mini-dominated entry thoroughout qualifying, setting pole and walking away to an easy win over Jim Runciman and Lance Stannard. The Mustang of Ian Bell finished fourth ahead of Tim Bradley's Mini, the Cortina GT of Matthew Smith and the Ron Moller Holden EH.

Meeke was scratched out of the next scratch event which was duely taken out by Runciman. Smith and Trevor

Stannard hiccuped at Novus before Moller grabbed second ahead of Bradley, Andrew Eaton (Cooper S) and Lance and Trevor Stannard.

The feature was the 15 lapper which Meeke led for the opening couple of laps before being forced into retirement. Bell (with Stephen Smith sharing) took the lead but was run down by Runciman who had Joe Ricciardo along for the ride. They too stuck problems that would not see them at the end.

The Stannards took the win with Bradley and Phil Davenport filling second while Moller was third on the road. However despite effecting the pitstop, had no co-driver and was thus ruled out, surrendering third to Bell's Mustang.

State Championship - Lakeside/Queensland Raceway - October 23-24/31

THREE DIFFERENT WINNERS emerged from the Lakeside round after Steve Emson dominated qualifying. His Falcon took the first race comfortably from Kevin Heffernan with John English third driving the Valiant Charger.

Emson led the second race until he retired after five laps, handing victory to Heffernan who was driving Anthony Beahan's Torana. English was second while Geoff McCrystal in a Falcon GT was third ahead of Graeme Smith (Torana) and Ken Nelson's Cooper S.

Allen Broughen's XT Falcon took out the third race narrowly from Heffernan with Garry Brown's Chev Nova snaring the final podium place in front of Smith, Nelson, the EH of Garry Michael and Kerry Finn's Torana.

A WEEK LATER Chris Hinton debuted his new Chev Camaro and topped the grid sheets on all three layouts (Long circuit, Short A and Short B) and won all four races.

Brown chased the new Nc

machine over the two preliminary short circuit races with Beahan and Smith taking a third each. In the seven lapper Hinton was again victorious, beating Beahan by almost three seconds while Smith filled the minor placing ahead of Nelson, Stratton and Patterson.

Hinton also took out the final race to cap off a perfect debut. Brown was second and Beahan next ahead of Smith John Attard and Nelson.



Roman Autotek series - Groups Nb and Nc - October 23-24



Winners and weather decide

A HUGE STORM race morning appeared to threaten the final Roman Autotek races for the year. But the circuit dried quickly for Jose Fernandez and Cameron Worner to take a win each. Then rain returned and Cameron Tilley revelled in the conditions to score victory. The wet also suited the Minis which took second and third.

Qualifying

THE EARLY SESSION was the one to be in to nab a good time, for the track became wetter later. Worner was the quickest overall, his Falcon circulating in a best of 50.9946 seconds and eight tenths faster than the Monaro of Brian Potts. Next best was Mike Dyer from Andrew Bergan's Mini, the Falcons of Fernandez, Matthew Hunt and Russell Stanford, and Steve Land's Capri.

Jason Humble followed with the Valiant of Tilley alongside and Doug Westwood's Mustang, the Torana of Michael Terry, Michael Kennedy's new Falcon and Greg Toepfer having a guest steer in Garry

Kirwan's Torana.

Rod Stait lined up behind them with Ian Sawtell while behind them were Allan Reid's Falcon, the Nova of Ross Muller, Rick Rogers' Cooper S, Stephen Bradley's XW Falcon, the Peter Ullrich Fairlane, Steve Mason's Mustang which would not race, and Graeme Hart in the EH.

Another not starting was the Lotus Cortina of Rob

Ingram. It crashed causing extensive damage.

Race One (5 laps)

POLEMAN WORNER MADE a copybook start, but Potts was slow away. Fernandez slotted second ahead of Potts, Dyer, Bergan, Hunt, Tilley and Stanford. Humble was next from Sawtell, Muller, Reid, Ullrich, Toepfer and Kennedy.

Land was next after a bad first lap that seen him only ahead of Terry, Rogers and Stait who was also unfashionably well back.

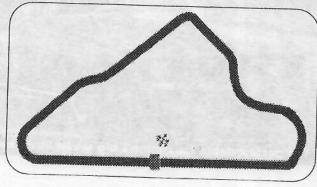
Almost from the outset Worner had a race on his hands, keeping Fernandez at bay.

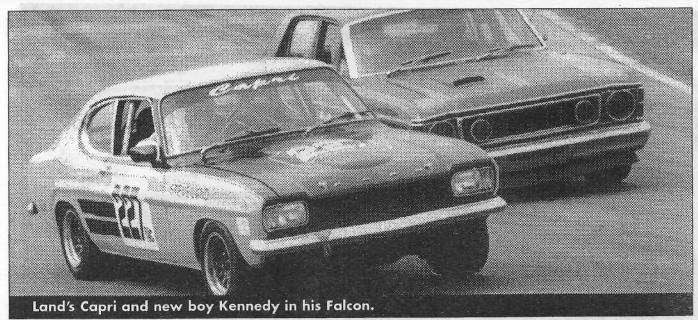
Bergan lost places to Hunt and Tilley on the second lap then Stanford later. Behind Humble dipped to tenth as Westwood went past. Ullrich was another who surrendered places, in his case to Toepfer and Kennedy as Stait climbed from the back of the field.

Fernandez couldn't get past Worner until the last lap from

where he won. The pair had gapped Potts while Hunt was a narrow victor in the three-way dice for fourth over Dyer and Tilley. Stanford was next in front of Bergan, Westwood and Sawtell who overtook Humble on the last lap.

Race Two (8 laps)
FERNANDEZ GRABBED THE
lead immediately from Worner and
Tilley. Meanwhile Dyer was
attempting to shake off Hunt, Potts,





Sawtell, Westwood, Sandford and Bergan.

Humble was 11th in front of Reid, Stait, Muller, Kennedy, Land, Ullrich, Terry and Kirwan back in his usual seat, but not for long.

Stait charged to be just outside the top ten on the second lap, but then dropped to the rear the next time around. Another more successful in coming through the pack was Reid who ultimately took eighth while Sawtell was a race casualty along with Hunt and Rogers.

Meanwhile Worner hounded Fernandez until the latter understeered off in the esses on lap six. Tilley maintained third ahead of Dyer while Potts picked up fifth ahead of Westwood and Bergan as Humble and Muller rounded out the top ten behind Reid.

Race Three (10 laps)
THE RAIN ARRIVED for the last. Worner opted out, Potts

Barrow recovered to finish ahead of Owers, the Harris' who were almost in unison, Brigden and Tight.

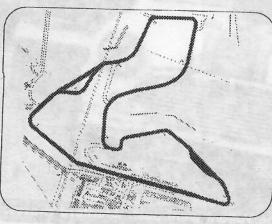
Group Na had Priddle mixing with the Nb's before with MacKenzie and Rodenhuis disputing second. The latter

On lap two Gruber passed Marshall and a lap later Anderson pulled a similar move on Callan. However the Vauxhall driver struck back on the next tour before the Alfa dropped to near last.

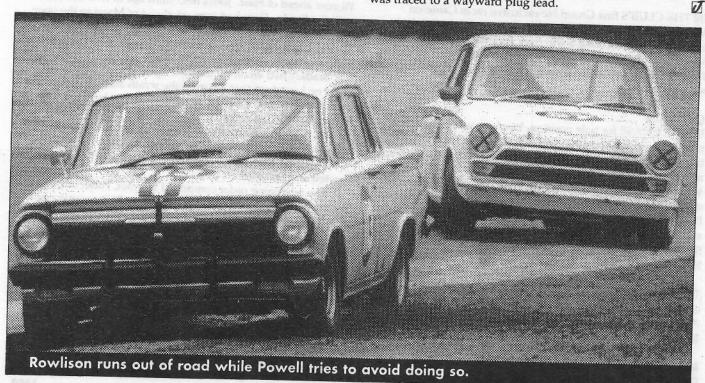
Race Three (8 laps)

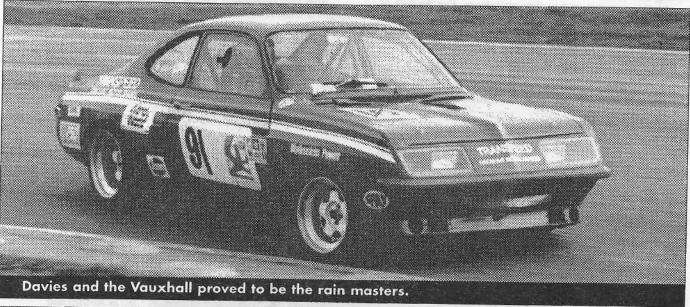

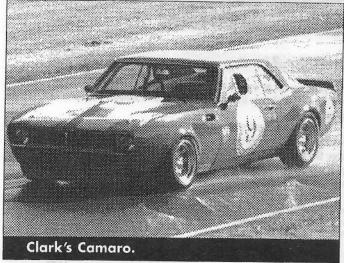

At the front Voyazides was all on his own for the dura-

tion, pulling out at over a second and a half per lap. So quick was the Greek driver that only Dodd got to within a second of his fastest lap!

With Voyazides long gone and making things look easy it was Dodd who produced the drive of the race with a storming drive back through the field to fourth after spinning off on the opening lap when he and Roger Cope's Jaguar S Type touched at Goddards.

By lap four he was back up to tenth before climbing to an eventual fifth at the flag which became fourth once Les Nash was handed his penalty.

The overall winner of each round and each class at any given round shall be determined by the combined points from all races. Where a tie exists the winner will be the hightst placed finisher in the nominated feature race.

When the grid capacity at a round is exceeded, the field shall be split into heats, with the respective heats counting towards the relevant class points. The Feature race shall be made up of the fastest from qualifying up to the grid limit for that track, with the balance contesting the Consolation race; points shall be awarded to the finishers in each and to the finishers in each class over both the Feature and Consolation races.

Competitors do not necessarily need to compete in all six rounds to be eligible for championship awards.

A competitor can score points in different vehicles during the year subject to par 1.1 however points shall be awarded for the capacity class in which the individual vehicles fall.

POINTS ARE AWARDED to financial members only and cover the four categories of Group Na, two Divisions of Group Nb and Group Nc. The six best results will determine the final outcome. Outright sees 10 points awarded for first within the group while second achieves 8, third 7, and etc down to 1 for ninth. Class placings (as per the CAMS manual) are as follows:

These are awarded for outright and class placings and divided by the number of scratch races held at the meeting. Bonus points are also allotted. Three additional points are allocated for entering and participating, two for any handicap event that is entered and completed, and one for recording the fastest lap in class for the entire meeting.

In a combined field of Nb Division I and II the Division I cars must finish ahead of the Division II cars to receive full outright points. The Nb breakup of cars and drivers are allocated to a divi-

sion based on lap times at various circuits. Division II competitors will be reclassified if their lap times eclipse the Division I benchmark.

Attending interstate Historic meetings on the same date as a pointscoring NSW event entitles the competitor points in the same manner as competing locally provided the individuals supply official result sheets within 14 days. The 1999 Appendix J Cup for Nb Div I and II is decided on the results of the three NSW Historic Meetings at Oran Park, Eastern Creek and Wakefield Park.
