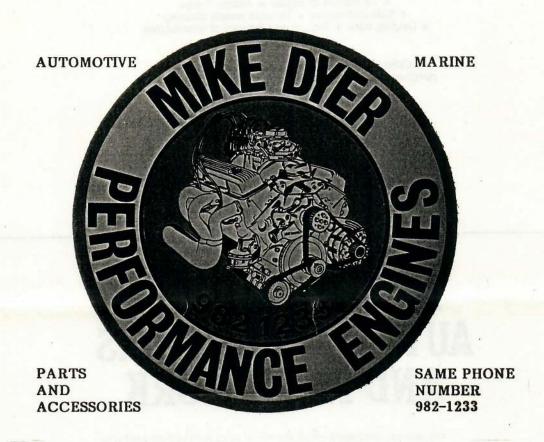
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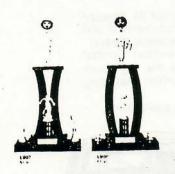

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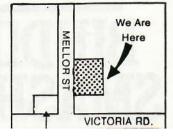
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EDITORIAL

Obituary - Ron Hodgson

Ron Hodgson, aged 60 was a founding member of the Appendix J Association and President in 1981/82. He was found dead at Watson's Bay on Wednesday 28th March.

Ron Hodgson loved cats - especially Jaguars. He sold them for a living and drove a convertible Jaguar V-12 XJS with HODDO on its numberplates.

A dab hand at driving them quickly, he set a lap record around Mt Panorma in the early 1960s in his red 3.8-litre Jaguar.

Late last year he took that car to Oran Park raceway, where some of his Jaguar customers were receiving driving training. Ever the boy racer and ever eager to have a bit of fun Hoddo showed he had lost none of his driving skills and rocketed around the track.

As he drove into the pits, he was laughing and waving at his customers, who looked a little stunned that their Jaguar dealer should behave with such exuberance.

In many ways Mr Hodgson was the last of the old-style dealers. He represented an era of flamboyant car salesmen who aimed at a high public profile.

He was one of the first to advertise on television and appeared personally in his commercials. In the late 1970s he boasted he was spending around \$500,000 a year on TV advertising, as well as being a prominent supporter of motor sport, both as a competitor and as a team backer.

Ron was the business himself - he was such a charismatic and colourful person. Hodgson was a tireless worker for charities and a generous doner. After two heart attacks he also became a champion for the National Heart Foundation.

It became one of the legends of Australian motor sport that his Hodgson-sponsored Torana won the 1976 James Hardie 1000 by limping home in the final laps with smoke pouring from the rear end.

Sydney businessman Sir Arthur George said he believed the secret of Mr Hodgson's successes, given his background, was his cheerful nature and great ability to win friends.

Sir Arthur and Mr Hodgson had been under pressure for some time after his original business faltered in October 1987. "But he seemed to be able to wear his problems - always charming, affable, always polite and civilised," he said.

Ron had many friends within the Appendix J ranks and will be sadly missed by all who knew him or shared his dreams and ambitions.

Mr Hodgson leaves a widow and stepson from his second marriage and two daughters and a son from his first.

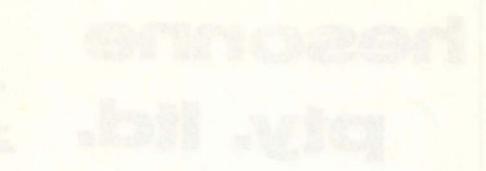
