# EDITORIAL etc

The future of Appendix J racing must come under debate when the promoters continue to invite the Association to meetings and the Association members fail to fill grids.

The essence of Appendix J racing is racing vehicles which are historically based but are not historic vehicles in their own right. This prerequisite has meant that a number of different vehicles have been built that did not originally run under the old rules. This has swelled the ranks of competitors and meant that the "new" Association, now in its tenth year has probably more vehicles able to compete in the Association's events than were ever available in the day. Where are all those vehicles?

I have recently been seeking views from various members at race meetings to ascertain what remedy we, as a committee and club, can apply to fix the entry problem. Invariably the recession is blamed for poor attendances yet other classes are still filling grids and subsequently attracting the promoters attention. Appendix J is having trouble filling the grid at an Amaroo Open meeting which is a round of the Touring car championship.

Suggestions have been made that we need to either:

- make the racing closer and thus more interesting
- reduce the costs both running and entry
- introduce limited advertising
- package the events
- reduce the number of events by being more selective
- seek series sponsors
- retreat to historic only racing
- remove all locking type differentials

Combinations of some of the above reasons were also suggested and the above is by no means an exhaustive list. If you are a competitor or intend to be one then you should think about what we should do to ensure that racing, as we have come to know it, continues. After ten years some changes may indeed be needed as the class in its' day went on to become improved production, then Group C and so on.

I would welcome all suggestions as we approach the Warwick Farm birthday. The planning for next years calendar and events has already commenced. There is nothing like a full grid to silence the detractors of which we seem to suddenly have many, and a perfect time would be the last Open Meeting at Amaroo. See you there!

#### TYRES

The last general meeting overwhelmingly supported the trial introduction of a control tyre series, restricted to club meetings and a small series to run at these meetings until the end of the year.

The Association has negotiated with a number of manufacturers and distributors for a tyre which met the criteria of high performance and modest cost. In addition a single compound across the spectrum of tyres (viz 10, 13, 14 and 15 inch wheels) was desirable along with better wearing characteristics. Other categories have faced this choice and selected tyres to suit the application so we felt that we could achieve the same result with a careful selection. We also faced the migration of tyre sizes from 70 series to 60 series which increased the choice problem.

In the end we have chosen a Yokohama based tyre range to suit all the conditions including wear and temperature curing (going off). If the tyres trial prove successful then we will review arrangements for next year in light of the less and less range of 70 series tyres.

The basic series rules are as follows:

Yokohama tyres only may be used for nominated races to score points.

Tyres will be available at a special price under a voucher system from three outlets in Sydney, Toddies at Rydalmere, Owens and Frank Mitchells. An additional outlet in the South is to be included.

To get the special price you must be a financial member of the Association. No limit is placed at this stage on the number of tyres you purchase but all purchases will be recorded.

No tyre improvers are to be used and durometer readings will be taken at random and compared to Yokohama data.

The prices include fitting and balancing on your rim. Cutting and buffing are allowed but tyres must conform to the CAMS manual as to wear limits. Prices range from \$75 to \$120 with the majority of tyres under \$100 each, fitted and balanced.

TYRES and WEAR Tom Amos

During the discussion over the last few months on the introduction of a control tyre for Appendix J club meetings a number of misleading statements and misunderstandings on tyres were apparent. In order to clear the air and to help those who think that this science is all about dollars then consider some of the following comments and see if they agree with what you thought was the way a tyre worked.

Tyres, particularly high performance radial ones as used in Appendix J are usually constructed from a blend of natural and synthetic rubbers with the addition of carbon to create a tyre with particular traction characteristics. Such tyres are designed to stick to the roadway by gripping the surface which results in this traction being used to propel the vehicle. In creating traction the tyre abrades against the track surface and wears away some of the rubber compound of the tyre. The softer the tyre, the higher the wheel weight and the higher the traction load to be transferred all lead to increased abrasion wear and subsequent rubber loss.

Conversely harder tyres, lower weights and less loads reduce the amount of rubber lost. The tyres performance limit is termed the traction limit and this occurs when the input wheel load exceeds the amount of abrasive grip that the tyre can generate against the roadway surface. A simple rule is the softer the tyre the more traction it can create and the quicker it wears out. In addition temperature and tyre surface area also impact the grip that a tyre may generate. Higher temperatures mean softer tyres and thus more grip whilst wider tyres mean more roadway contacted per unit of wheel load and thus more grip. Grouving reduces the surface area in contact with the road.

Now how do you apply all these variables to determine what tyres and at what temperatures they should be operated. Well that would be telling and the Bellett needs all the advantages it can get but some general rules do apply.

Hardness Measured with a durometer which estimates the elasticty of the tyre and reads out on a scale beteeen 0 and 100 points. Typical R tyres at room temperature measure around 50 to 55 points new and then age around 2 points per use for the first few uses then are aged. All tyres age from birth, the softer ones 2 to 3 times quicker than the harder ones!

Hardness drops around 3 points for ever 20 degrees F above 120 degrees. The hotter the more wear until around 220 F when meltdown occurs.

All tyres wear to create grip and there is thus no substitue for new tyres ... just don't leave them in the sun as it creates the same effect.

Lower pressures create more grip but can mean more tread lift and other problems.

Harder tyres such as those proposed for the Yokohama series (63 to 67 points) will age less and wear better than the softer R tyres and thus will have less grip unless you can really heat them up!

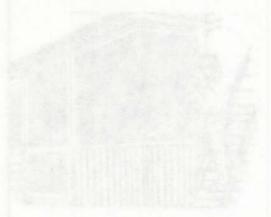
