EDITORIAL

This magazine covers a number of topical issues as usual that have arisen in the Appendix J world but none has more heat than that of the current tyre saga. For those who have missed what has gone on over the last few years, I should quickly recap.

Firstly, after a number of years of discussion that started first in Victoria, it was proposed by CAMS that a return to a road based tyre formula was to occur from January 1993. Again the Trades Hall state successfully introduced a delay at the last minute and an exemption of 12 months was granted by CAMS with the introduction to occur from January 1994. The reason was stated that a number of competitors still had the old tyres and a 12 month period would be sufficient to allow all to wear out their stocks. Fair enough but some people 12 months later still claim that they have been not given enough notice, they are dangerous, its all too expensive, we definitely had R tyres in the day, I'll go slower and so on and on.

The fact is that some minor relativities may change between cars on some circuits; changes more towards the way it was in the day rather than the processional way it has become ... and that can't be such a bad thing when you consider the whole category. But I forgot that not all actually think of the category, rather some just think of how they will go in it. Racing of historic touring cars is a privilege, a real personal buzz, that if it is to continue on unabated, the category requires careful planning and promotion so that it is self perpetuating for those who may wish to come after.

The only way this can occur is to continue to make the sport more attractive, exciting and appealing for new racers, promoters and spectators alike. It would be by pure chance that any personal interest motives or views could lead to a better outcome for the category than a planned approach to change and in this situation I feel this is clearly seen by the vast majority.

The new formula is here and it appears to me it is now in the interest of all the Associations that we should at least try to see if the tyres will be an overall better package rather than have continued bickering about something that was actually decided some years ago. Of course not everyone is fortunate and has the luxury of a level view so we can only hope.

Onto other subjects: the full calendar, as best we have it is set out in the rear of the magazine and I would draw your attention to the pointscore events that are marked with an '*' so they are easily identified. I believe a new point score will be introduced for some rounds ... more later.

REPRINT OF MEMORANDUM FROM CAMS' TIM SCHENKEN TO STEWARDS OF THE MEETING AND CLERKS OF COURSE

SUBJECT: BLACK FLAG

Dated 14 January 1994, file no: A27/2, Doc No: TTS:gc-141

It was reported at a recent meeting of the Motor Racing Executive that there has been instances of drivers ignoring the Black Flag and no subsequent action being taken.

The Committee discussed a reported increase in drivers not seeing the Black Flag, however Steward's reports have not included such findings resulting in any enquiry being held.

I have no doubt that the Clerks of Course and Stewards are well aware of Appendix H and the requirements of flag signals generally.

They are also aware of the consequences of failure to meet the requirements of the rules.

Nevertheless it seems that attention of all Clerks of Course and Stewards should be drawn to the requirement of Appendix H generally, and to Section 3E in particular.

I would expect that an enquiry will always be held if a driver is reported as taking more than one lap to pit, having been shown the Black Flag. Clerks of Course are expected to make an appropriate charge where a significant number of laps under the black flag occurs.

I look forward to your co-operation in this matter which will ensure that racing remains safe as can be reasonably expected in 1994.
