The aim has been to support Historic events and then series events such as Amaroo and various interstate series that we have promoted in conjunction with the other Associations and in the main this has worked. Small grids are always a problem and some pre planning does seem to help.

There is never a happy medium but I suppose that some races are better than none or too many.

Speaking of rules, it was nice to see the times come down towards those of late last year on R tyres. A different style is required but as was said from the start, the relativities will not change, only the closeness of the racing. hear that Gordon Leven of Yokohama is to come to the August meeting and talk about the new A 008 road tyre that has made such a positive impact on the big cars, both here and in Victoria. Should be worth quite a listen!

As to the ramblings of Cummo et al at Amaroo that Syd has referred to elsewhere in the Magazine, the Association has yet to receive a copy of the HCC April meeting minutes so it is hard to comment on the proceedings, although it is worth noting in recent history that there has not been any active Group N persons at any stage on the HCC committee.

I suppose the results we appear to be getting second hand reflect how well all our interests and views have been represented.
