I also attended the HSRCA meeting on the same subject and discovered a movement to race pre 57 road cars in a modified form of our class. Simply amazing!

I have consulted widely with most of the other States and Associations and the views we expressed about certainty and no cannibalisation are common.

Finally, the Presentation night is on in October and tickets are available from Anne Bailey and at the meetings. It will be a great night and very inexpensive as the Association has again kicked the tin to help defray some of the costs. Come along.

Meeting closed 11.15pm.



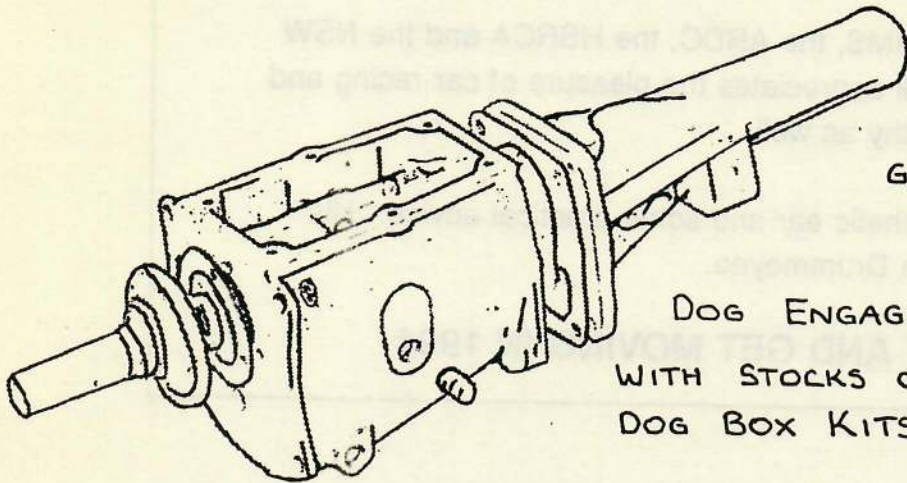
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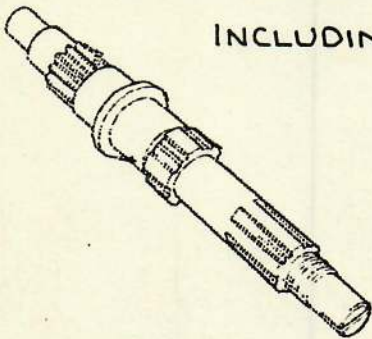
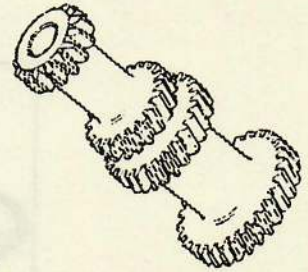
