PRESIDENT'S REPORT

It is with great regret that I must announce that group N will not be competing at Bathurst in October 1995. We have been asked to submit a proposal to run at the Touring Car rounds in March and October 1996. So....maybe next year???

For those wanting to compete at Adelaide, a point about helmets. The Australian Standard AS1698 is not recognised as suitable for INTERNATIONAL EVENTS. Please refer to pages 6-9 of the '95 Cams manual for specified standards.

While on the subject of helmets, it must be noted that all helmets are required to be submitted to Cams ANNUALLY! Helmets must have a Cams approved label affixed, separate to the standards sticker. This has not been enforced up to now by the scrutineers, probably because they have been unaware of this rule themselves. I believe this is about to change, so please have your helmet checked before you next race.

It has been suggested to me that this committee has not been actively promoting the new Nc and Na categories. I don't believe this is the case, but the committee members, and myself, are available if any member has some ideas to help these new classes. Even though we have a number of new members, with these vehicles under construction, it is very hard to promote these classes with only a couple of cars ready to race.

It must be stated that all members of this Associations are eligible to stand for a position on this committee, whether they are owners or competitors of Na, Nb or Nc cars. You, the members, may also consider whether the time is right to expand the committee with positions for Na, Nb and Nc competitor representatives.

On a more positive note, you will see elsewhere in this newsletter, details of the K-mac series prizes with \$3,000 in product up for grabs. This will be spread around the classes as well, so let's support those who support us.

MEETING DATES: April 9 25 June 30 July

At each meeting a preliminary and trophy race will be conducted. Starters will be at the discretion of the organisers.

POINTS: Will be awarded on the basis of 9,6,4,3,2,1 in the trophy race

AWARDS: Trophies will be awarded to 1st, 2nd and 3rd outright on the trophy race

END OF YEAR AWARDS: 1s

TIE BREAKER: In the event of a tie in the Series, the winner will be determined by the number of first placings on the trophy race, and if necessary by the number of second placings in the trophy race, and then is necessary by the number of third placings in the trophy race.
